In our daily life, we know that we have problems and challenges in our family, at school or with our friends ... and many people live in terrible conditions caused by war, climate change, migration, violence...




The psalm then gives the answer to this question. It says: "because you are with me."

I feel really happy when I do that after a difficult and challenging day...



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
